Spring Trip Policy

Being assigned to In-school suspension (from chorus or any other class) jeopardizes the privilege of participating in field trips. Members are expected to keep discipline referrals at zero. Should a member be assigned to in-school suspension, for any reason, then the member may be denied the privilege of traveling with the organization. This includes the privilege of participating in the spring chorus trip. Should a student not be permitted to complete a public performance because of ISS assignment, the student will be allowed to make-up the performance as described in the performance contract.

Participation in the spring trip is a privilege. At any time during the school year if the director deems it necessary for any reason (behavior, attitude, lack of evidence of motivation, etc) a student may be removed from the spring trip. Should this need arise, the student will be subject to a full refund of any cash payments made toward the trip with the exception of:

- Fundraising money—No fundraising money is refundable to a student for any reason
- Donations from someone other than the legal parent or guardian.

If the director removes a student from the spring trip, the transfer policy, as stated on the chorus website applies.

A student is tardy for rehearsal, unless seated in assigned seat when tardy bell rings. Entering the room or any other location other than sitting in assigned seat, upon bell ring is considered a tardy.

1st tardy - Sign roster, located just inside the chorus room door, for Friday detention 3:10 – 3:40. Friday detention is in the chorus room. Non attendance will result in the consequences for the second tardy.

2nd tardy - Discipline referral for Detention

3rd tardy and any additional tardiness - ISS
